

Julieanne Forrest & Dida Condria in Concert

<u>MUSIC</u> Fri 5 Jan | 8pm | €16/€14

Kick off the new year with an intimate night of classical music from violinist Julieanne Forrest & pianist Dida Condria, two of Ireland's brightest and best young musicians. They will be performing Prokofiev's Sonata No.1, Bhrams' Sonata No.2, and Ravel's Tzigane

Julieanne Forrest is a 20-year-old violinist from Ireland and studies at the MUK Vienna with Prof. Pavel Vernikov. Between 2015 and 2021 she studied at the Royal Irish Academy of Music under Dr. Fionnuala Hunt where she was part of the RIAM Young Scholar programme and the Eversheds Sutherland Accelerator Academy. In September 2019 Julieanne was announced as the National Concert Hall of Ireland's Young Musician of the Year for Strings.

20-year-old pianist Dida Condria began her musical studies at the Royal Irish Academy of Music with Prof. Reamonn Keary at the age of 6, and she gave her national Irish debut shortly after with conductor Finghin Collins and the RIAM Symphony Orchestra. Dida was a Keyboard Category Finalist in the most recent edition of the BBC Young Musician of the Year Competition, and the winner of the BBC Walter Todds Bursarv. Her most notable international achievements include winning 1st prize at the Scottish International Youth Piano Competition, 1st prize at the Crescendo International Music Competition and 1st prize at the John Field International Piano Competition.

Movement Workshop with Mufutau Yusuf & Lucas Katangila

This improvisation workshop invites students to engage with their movement vocabularies and imaginations by challenging themselves, working through their limits and sharing dance with others. With an emphasis on embracing one's own personal groove, it is a very physical and energetic practice, fun and suitable for dance enthusiasts of varying experiences.



Mufutau Yusuf is a Nigeria-born Irish performer, choreographer, teacher, and curator based between Ireland and Brussels. A dancer with Wim Vandekeybus/ Ultima Vez in Belgium and Ireland with Liz Roche Company, Mufutau is a Solstice Arts Centre Associated Artist and a recipient of the Irish Arts Council Dance Bursary 2020 and Project Award 2022 and 2023.

Lucas Katangila is a dancer, choreographer, and activist of Congolese nationality. Lucas is a co-founder of Busara Dance Company from DRC and NDOTO GOMA KIDS (Dream of Kids from Goma), a dance and humanitarian project in his homeland of Goma working towards the rights of violated children in ethnic conflicts and against the enrolment of child soldiers.



This body of new works developed for Solstice Arts Centre stems from a period of research that looked broadly and specifically at forms of empathy and altruism and the complicated nature of how these elements are played out in social relations. This research led artist Mark Garry to an increased interest in forms of societal displacement and what occurs when socially shared aspects of belonging are eroded.

The title of the exhibition 'to hold or to be held', in addition to referencing human intimacy and connectedness, also acts as a form of methodological approach. Many of the art works that make up the exhibition implicate systems where modest two and three dimensional elements combine, where the art work is simultaneously contained and a container, where one form or material sustains another. This model acts as a means to consider modes of inter reliance between materials, form and meaning. The fold is a persisting element of the art works, where the fold acts as a method of enabling forms or possibilities that are simultaneously elaborating and stabilising.

Whilst located in research this work prioritises the poetic over the didactic, where research elements are subtly embedded, and the works combine to enable an encounter that merges modesty and complexity.

This publication is the second collaboration between artist, Mark Garry, and graphic designer, Louise Reddy, coinciding with Garry's exhibition at Solstice Arts Centre.

Rather than addressing Garry's artistic responses directly, the texts that make up this publication respond to the broader research area that informed the exhibition. The book implicates texts by Stephen Doyle, Mark Garry, Barbara Kneževic, Michael O'Hara and Louise Reddy. These authors respond to the research subject from a range of art theory, design, musicological, philosophical and psychoanalytical perspectives, and will join us in the gallery for an informal discussion on these elements.




Remnant investigates the interconnectedness of place, time, and memory.

In this new exhibition by Willie Doherty, starkly atmospheric images of elemental landscapes formed by the long slow processes of geological time exist alongside disregarded urban spaces shaped by the consequences of human intervention, conflict, and neglect. Through the space of time, the histories of these places transform, becoming the fictions of memory.

Remnant explores how landscape acts as a repository of memory, as a site to construct and sustain images and myths of national identity, of self and of others. The camera examines the landscape as a site of political and ideological intervention, a place shaped by time, and natural processes of decay and renewal. The work articulates new perspectives on transgenerational trauma and our apprehension and uncertainty about the future.

Fusing voice and soundscapes with autonomous yet interconnected photographic and video imagery, the work is structured as dynamic interplay, expanding the narrative, spatial, and atmospheric connections between still and moving images. The work investigates dualities of movement and inertia, abandonment and resilience, presence and absence, permanence and impermanence, the familiar and the unknown.

The fragmentary narrative strands of the work generate temporal and spatial ruptures, animating the experience of the gallery space through the shifting dynamic perceptions of the viewer. Memory becomes a measure of time and space, of dislocation and connection, of what is real and what is imagined.

ENDLESS, a film produced in 2020 by Willie Doherty, makes its premiere cinematic screening at Solstice. A sublimely powerful work, the film features a provocatively restrained performance by Christopher Eccleston as a man alone, someone and no-one, disappearing into shadows of black and white. ENDLESS evokes an atmosphere of restrictive containment and eternal unrelenting constraint.

Screening a selection of films by Willie Doherty, the program includes Sometimes I Imagine It's My Turn (1998), Non-Specific Threat (2004), Passage (2006), Closure (2005), Ancient Ground (2011), The Amnesiac (2014), and Buried (2009). Total run time 60 minutes.

Since graduating with a First Class Honours degree in Acting in November of 2019, she has subsequently gone on to star as Nina Scully in Thomas Kilroy's The Big Chapel, and as Helena in Drama at Inish in the Abbey Theatre. Grace originated the role of Cara in the US Tour of Find Your Way Home, which also ran off-Broadway.

Her undergraduate essay concerning the work of Caryl Churchill won the prestigious Regional Global Undergraduate Award 2019, and was published in The Undergraduate Journal. Mufutau Yusuf is a Nigeria-born Irish performer, choreographer, teacher, and curator based between Ireland and Brussels. A graduate of Salzburg Experimental Academy of Dance, Mufutau is a dancer with Wim Vandekeybus/Ultima Vez in Belgium and in Ireland with Liz Roche Company, John Scott's IMDT, United Fall, Catherine Young Dance, to name a few. Mufutau debuted his first full length work in 2022, titled 'Òwe', which premiered in New York and subsequently at Dublin Fringe Festival and various other venues and festivals in Ireland. Mufutau is an associate artist with Solstice Arts Centre and Liz Roche Company and a recipient of the Irish Arts Council Dance Bursary award 2020 and Project Award 2022 and 2023. His passion for improvisation and sharing has bought him to share his teaching

practice to various platforms, festivals and institutions such as Tipperary international Dance Festival, University of Limerick, the American University in Washington, among others. Mufutau is also a co-curator of 'TW1' (Train With One), a bi-monthly workshop platform which aims to bridge the gap between the Irish contemporary dance scene with that of continental Europe.





Selma Daniel

Selma Daniel is a dance artist and choreographer, with an MA in Contemporary Dance Performance from the University of Limerick. She has over 20 years of experience in dance performance, choreography and education.

She is a dance artist interested in investigating dance for young audiences. Her aim is to create socially engaging dance for screen, stage and the public space. Her work is dynamic, often exploring topics of identity, gender, feminism, culture and equality.

Siún O'Connor

Siún O'Connor is a filmmaker from Walterstown, Co. Meath. After completing an MA in Film & TV Studies in DCU, O'Connor co-produced her first short film. Mechanic won the Tiernan Mc-Bride Award for Best Short Live Action Film at the Galway Film Fleadh 2013 and began a career in film production.

Commissioned by Solstice, Siún's latest short film Irreverence is a dark comedy about a strained mother-daughter relationship. It is O'Connor's writer/ directorial debut; the script won Best Short Film to Bring Change at the Paris International Film Festival in January 2021, and has since featured at numerous film festivals internationally.

In 2021, Siún founded Meath Film Collective, who hosted the first Meath Film Festival in Solstice on September 17th 2022. The festival provided great opportunities for filmmakers to get involved, showcase their work and strengthen the vibrant filmmaking community in the county. It highlighted the talent in Meath and the day was filled with workshops, discussions and film screenings.

Tom Moran

Tom Moran is a writer-performer from Dublin, Ireland. In 2022, Tom's solo show, Tom Moran is a Big Fat Filthy Disgusting Liar, premiered at the Dublin Fringe Festival where it won the Best New Writing Award from Olivier Award Winning theatre company, Fishamble. The play has also been optioned by Deadpan Pictures where Tom is currently developing it for the TV comedy-drama space.
